

**SUMMARY**

Lagan Precision Co. Ltd. (Lagan Precision) is a supplier of camera lens modules to companies such as Apple. It ranks last in the benchmark, disclosing less information on its forced labor policies and practices than its peers and scoring zero on every theme. Although Lagan Precision discloses its Corporate Social Responsibility Practice Principles on its website, they are only available in Taiwanese. The company may consider strengthening its disclosure and practices on the themes of commitment and governance, traceability, and monitoring, including by developing and disclosing a supplier code of conduct.

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## OPPORTUNITIES FOR IMPROVEMENT

**Commitment and Governance:** The company is encouraged to develop and disclose a supplier code of conduct that includes all four rights outlined in the ILO Declaration on Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work, including the prohibition of forced labor and human trafficking. It is further encouraged that the company establish responsibilities and accountability for the implementation of such a standard and train internal staff and suppliers on this standard.

**Traceability and Risk Assessment:** To demonstrate a strong understanding of its supply chains, the company may consider disclosing the names and addresses of first-tier suppliers, the countries of below-first-tier suppliers, the sourcing countries of raw materials at high risk of forced labor, and information on its suppliers' workforce. The company is further encouraged to assess forced labor risks across its supply chains and disclose the risks identified.

**Monitoring:** The company may consider adopting and disclosing a supplier monitoring process to verify that its suppliers are compliant with its supply chain standards. Implementing specific practices, such as interviewing workers and conducting unannounced audits of suppliers may help the company detect forced labor risks in its supply chains. Disclosing information on the results of its supplier audits, such as the percentage of suppliers audited annually or a summary of findings, assures stakeholders that the company has strong monitoring processes in place.

No
