

Eclat Textile Corp. Ltd. (Eclat Textile), a Taiwanese manufacturer of apparel and textile materials,¹ has taken no steps to address forced labor risks in its supply chains. It discloses significantly less information than the global sector average and does not seem to have taken any additional steps to address forced labor risks in its supply chains since its inclusion in the 2018 benchmark. Other Asian companies such as Asics or Pou Chen disclose taking stronger steps. The company does not disclose any steps it has taken to address the risks of alleged Uyghur forced labor across its supply chain tiers.

Eclat Textile discloses it has an agreement with suppliers in which suppliers are asked to follow a code of conduct. However, the code is not publicly available, and it is unclear whether it addresses forced labor. It states that it has a CSR committee that focuses on forced labor and human trafficking. Eclat Textile also discloses having an internal grievance policy that allows employees to report on labor-related grievances, but it does not disclose whether it ensures that grievance channels are available to workers in its supply chains to report on labor issues.

Additional steps the company could take include

- publicly disclosing a supplier code of conduct addressing the ILO core labor standards and integrating it into supplier contracts;
- disclosing internal responsibility and board oversight for implementing its supply chain policies; and
- developing a formal mechanism to report grievances regarding labor conditions in its supply chains for its suppliers' workers and relevant stakeholders.
